

CHIROPRACTIC ACT CHANGES ARE APPROVED

Four Registered Chiropractors, One Layman to Constitute Board

Four registered chiropractors and one layman will constitute an examining board under provisions of the Chiropractic Act, it was decided by the legislature, in passing this bill through committee of the whole assembly. The bill now stands ready for third and final reading.

Heretofore the examining board consisted of two chiropractors, two members of the medical faculty of the University of Alberta and one layman.

COMPLAINTS REGISTERED

The amendment was brought in when chiropractors registered complaints that the bill was unfair.

Attempt by Dr. J. L. McPherson, S.C., Vegreville, to hoist the bill, fell by the wayside. He pleaded that there should be enacted a law to establish basic sciences in the provinces to raise the standard of all healing professions.

In reply, Solon Low, S.C., Warner, who sponsored the bill, declared it to be the last "big kick of the medical profession to control the chiropractic profession."

DRUGLESS HEALERS

At one stage of his remarks, Mr. Low referred to "drugless healers".

"Did you say 'Douglas healers?'" queried L. A. Giroux, Liberal, Grouard.

"No, drugless healers, we have no way of controlling Douglas," replied Mr. Low.
